

Support for beginning readers and writers

The NLP [National Literacy Panel, 2006] found that English Language Learners learning to read in English, just like English speakers learning to read in English, benefit from explicit teaching in the components of literacy, such as phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, comprehension, and writing. The NLP reviewed five studies that, as a group, showed the benefits of structured, direct instruction for the development of literacy skills among English Language Learners.

EARLY LITERACY and MATHEMATICS

For students whose primary language is not English, reading, writing, and literacy skills must be addressed as quickly as possible so that effective instructional practices can be developed. Non-English-speaking students are not only beginning English Language Learners but beginning readers and writers as well. Most early learners will struggle with English development in the areas of vocabulary, word recognition, reading comprehension, and writing.

Classroom Suite provides students with explicit instruction in reading, writing, and mathematics, in addition to constructive practice and embedded assessments that allow teachers to gauge progress and individualize instruction for their students.

How Classroom Suite Works

instructions and modeling. All directions are voiced by the computer and can be repeated as many times as needed by the student.



"We do"—Provides opportunities for supported practice.

Students are guided to the correct answer through auditory and visual feedback.



"You do"—Provides independent practice. Progress is

monitored, and teachers can set mastery levels. If a level is not achieved, the student is returned automatically to the practice "We do" mode/level.

Effective writing instruction



Writing a complete sentence, a paragraph, or a story might seem insurmountable if the English Language Learner struggles with both the components and mechanics of writing.



Effective mathematics instruction


Classroom Suite uses on-screen manipulatives to help students build conceptual knowledge and move toward automaticity through timed problem solving while assessing their progress.






Customized instruction is available through the Teacher Management System.

Speech settings let teachers specify settings for the talking feature.




Check Work options let teachers specify how they want the program to respond to students' input or answers.


EARLY LITERACY and MATHEMATICS

Differentiated instruction is an approach to teaching and learning that provides students with a variety of methods for taking in information and making sense of what they learn. Differentiated instruction means adjusting the curriculum and presentation of lessons to the students' learning style rather than expecting students to modify their learning style to fit the lesson.


Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a framework for designing curricula that enables all individuals to learn. *Classroom Suite* supports English Language Learners, as it was designed around these principles:

Multiple Means of Representation



Students experience concepts through text, graphic, and sound instruction.

Multiple Means of Expression



Students have a variety of methods to demonstrate concept mastery.

Multiple Means of Engagement



Information is presented at the students' learning pace, keeping the interest level high.

English Language Learners who *learn to* read must simultaneously apply these skills and read to *learn*.


Kurzweil 3000 provides access to grade level core curriculum. Students can simply follow along as text is read in a mode individualized to their level and needs.



Learning of the English Language can be challenging

Kurzweil 3000 supports decoding for students with weak phonemic awareness and phonic skills:

- The pronunciation of text in English
- The ability to read text aloud numerous times
- Syllabification
- The ability to highlight and read words
- Audible dictionaries and a thesauri to deepen vocabulary understanding

Vocabulary enrichment is a critical factor in academic learning

Kurzweil 3000 supports vocabulary enrichment:

- Auditory reading of text
- Bilingual and English dictionaries, as well as support for picture dictionaries
- A thesaurus that generates a list of synonyms
- Visual tracking of words as the text is read
- A multisensory approach that connects with different learning styles
- Audio or text-based notations
- Highlight tools to mark challenging vocabulary
- Reinforcement of phonetic learning, as words can be divided into syllables
- Repeated play back of words or passages




Embedded study tools can help students create outlines and make notes.

Fluency is affected by a lack of proficiency in English

Kurzweil 3000 supports the teaching of fluency through:

- · Modeling of fluent oral reading
- Allowing a student to read text at his/her level of language proficiency
- Ensuring that students can practice listening to and reading text as often as necessary
- Reinforcing the flow and cadence of the English language
- Focusing on chunks of text by breaking reading into segments
- Training the eye to move more quickly across the page by gradually increasing reading speed
- Preventing students from skipping or missing parts of words
- Transforming reading from a passive process into an interactive one
- Providing timely feedback so students need not interrupt their reading flow

Proficient readers use strategies to promote reading comprehension

- Highlighting critical information in multiple colors
- Generating questions in the form of notes that can be extracted into a separate study documents
- Creating outlines or flash cards from highlighted text
- Comparing the original document and a text document at the same time, students can refer to the original while answering questions or summarizing


- Defining unknown words using dictionaries
- Use of a thesaurus to increase understanding and vocabulary
- Researching the Internet for additional background information
- Reading by Headers, to quickly gain general understanding of content
- Using Notes to jot down questions or comments



In combination, Kurzweil 3000's toolbars provide powerful supports for reading and writing

Good writers draw from a pool of strategies


- Auditory reading of written text as a means of proofreading for grammar, spelling, and content
- Highlighting key material for the purpose of writing
- Generate alternative word choices
- Using word prediction, spell checkers, and dictionaries to insure quality of written output
- Employing broader vocabulary by use of specific word lists
- Eliminating misuse of words by identification of homophones or easily confused words



Writers can work from outline to draft in a side-by-side view to maintain organization and flow of ideas.

Test-taking strategies allow students to demonstrate their knowledge

- Pre-reading, highlighting, note taking, and summarizing for more effective learning
- Creating outlines or study guides by extracting key information for review purposes
- Listening to instructions as many times as needed
- Listening to questions and answers to verify correctness
- Accessing necessary supports such as dictionaries and thesauri when allowed
- Creating study guides to review information and move it into long-term memory




Reading of tests or quizzes allows assessment of content knowledge without penalty for the inability to read English proficiently.
